International lecture and seminar series "ART AND HISTORIOGRAPHY — A MIMETIC CONSTELLATION"

Contemporary art's heightened interest in history materialises not least in the numerous artistic, art-theoretical and curatorial projects of the last years. From exhibition and publication formats concerned with the historicity of art and art as historiography to the focus on models of repetition, actualization and re-enactment: The actuality of contemporary art proves to be always already the contemporaneity of (its) history alike.

Departing from a redefinition of the concepts "HISTORIOGRAPHY" and "MIMESIS", this lecture series aims to reconsider the widely debated relation between contemporary art and forms of historiographical representation. In contrast to their classical reduction to being an accurate (pictorial) imitation and (re)narration of history, mimesis and historiography are reframed as operative and productive practices in themselves.

In so doing, the lecture series wants to question the all too simple dual understanding of (historical) reality and (artistic) representation and to put it up for debate by discussing concrete artistic and philosophical positions. On the other hand, it seeks to re-focus the forms of production and representation pertaining to artistic approaches to history and historical events as well as their aesthetic-political dimensions.
